SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT U.S. EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.
2. LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE PRELIMINARY LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDERS. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, AGENT, COACH OR TRAINER AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A \$30.00 NON-MEMBER REGISTRATION FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE; 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT AND ACADEMY CLASSES (Academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES. 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS; 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION, 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 11) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES.
3. **THE HORSE SHOW COMMITTEE** reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to, the show, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Any questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Committee, consisting of the Competition Manager, the Horse Show Secretary and the USEF Steward.
4. **ALL ENTRIES** are accepted with the understanding that the Santa Barbara National Horse Show will not be held responsible for any loss, damage, or injury to any horse exhibited or any article of any kind. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Horse Show Committee but solely at the risk of the exhibitor, who will be responsible for any loss, damage or injury to any person, animal or property occasioned by him, his agents or employees, or by any animal owned or exhibited by him, and shall indemnify the Santa Barbara National Horse Show against any and all loss, damage and liability thus occasioned including but not limited to any and all legal costs, including attorney fees, which may be incurred as a result thereof. The submitting of any entry form shall constitute an acceptance by each person signing same of the provisions herein set forth.
5. **ALL OWNERS AND EXHIBITORS** will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them or their agents to barns or other properties on the Showgrounds and will be billed accordingly.
6. **IN ADDITION TO ENTRIES** of persons suspended or expelled from the Federation, the Recognized competition may refuse any entry of an exhibitor or the participation of any agent, trainer, rider, driver or handler who has shown an objectionable attitude towards this Recognized competition or previous unsportsmanlike behavior at a Recognized competition or to its management.
7. **MANAGEMENT** reserves the right to cancel, consolidate or split classes depending upon entries received at closing date.
8. **THE HORSE SHOW COMMITTEE** reserves the privilege of substituting or changing judges if it becomes necessary. The Judges' decision in the show ring are their own responsibility and the Show Committee accepts no responsibility for these decisions.
9. **PROTESTS.** Please refer to GR 603 for complete rule.

10. **ENTRIES CLOSE AND MUST BE POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN FRIDAY, JUNE 11, 2010. ENTRIES POSTMARKED AFTER CLOSING DATE WILL AUTOMATICALLY BE ASSESSED A POST ENTRY FEE OF \$20 PER HORSE. IF ORIGINAL ENTRY IS MADE AT THE SHOW, THE POST ENTRY FEE PER HORSE SHALL BE \$30.00. NO ENTRIES, SUBSTITUTIONS, OR CLASS CHANGES WILL BE TAKEN OVER THE TELEPHONE. NO ENTRY IS VALID UNLESS ACCOMPANIED BY A CHECK.**
11. **REFUNDS.** Full refunds will be given if written notice is received by the Show Secretary before the closing of entries. Exhibitors scratching a horse for any reason after the official closing date shall forfeit all entry, stall and association fees, UNLESS a valid Veterinarian's or Doctor's certificate of disability for entered horse/rider is submitted to the Horse Show Secretary **PRIOR** to the first event of the horse show, in which case a \$30.00 fee will be assessed. If illness or injury after the start of the show should prevent exhibitor's participation in the balance of entered classes, a refund of unused class fees will be made, less a \$30.00 fee, providing the balance of classes are officially scratched and a doctor's certificate is provided within 48 hours of the close of the show. Stall and association fees will not be refunded.
12. **ADDS AND SCRATCHES.** Adds may be made at no extra charge until 4 PM on Tuesday, July 6. Scratches will receive full credit providing they are scratched by 4 PM Tuesday, July 6. After 4 PM on Tuesday, July 6, a penalty of \$5 per class will be charged for added classes. If classes are scratched **through the horse show office prior to the class** and after 4 PM on Tuesday, July 6, a full refund, less a \$5 per class scratch fee, will be given. **AN OPEN, SIGNED CHECK MUST BE ON FILE WITH THE SHOW SECRETARY TO COVER THESE ADDITIONAL FEES AND OTHER INCIDENTALS.**
13. **PENALTY.** There will be a penalty of \$50.00 if a check is refused by the bank for any reason. No checks will be processed through the bank a second time, and must be covered by a money order, cashiers check, cash or credit card, in addition to the penalty.
14. **NUMBERS.** No competition numbers will be released by the Horse Show Office until all entry blanks are complete, all necessary copies of registration papers, USEF membership cards and measurement cards have been seen, and all fees have been paid with a check or credit card. **EXHIBITORS MUST ALSO PROVIDE AN OPEN CHECK TO COVER ANY EXPENSES THAT MIGHT BE INCURRED BY THEM DURING THE COURSE OF THE SHOW, INCLUDING FEED AND BEDDING.**
15. **STABLING.** All stalls are approximately 10' by 10', of wood construction with top and bottom doors. **STALLS WILL BE AVAILABLE FROM 8:00 AM ON MONDAY, JULY 5th AND MUST BE VACATED NO LATER THAN NOON ON SUNDAY, JULY 11^H.** **NO FIRST BEDDING WILL BE FURNISHED.** Early arrivals will be charged @ \$20.00 per day, per stall.
16. **FEED AND BEDDING. NO FIRST BEDDING will be provided. Either straw or shavings can be used for bedding purposes.** Exhibitors must leave an open check with the horse show office, payable to the 19th D.A.A. **TO ORDER AHEAD, please call La Cumbre Feed at (805) 687-1880.**
17. **TRAINERS** wishing to split the payment of their tack rooms and feed/bedding must fill out forms provided by the horse show office, no later than Thursday, July 8.
18. **FOOTING** in all arenas is a combination of sand, dirt, shavings and inorganic material. Arenas are 125' x 250'.
19. **DOGS and ALL OTHER PETS** must be on leashes at all times. Stray animals will be impounded and removed from the grounds.

20. **Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.**
21. **IT IS COMPULSORY** for riders in all Hunter, Jumper, Hunt Seat Equitation, and Paso Fino classes, where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear a properly fitting headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.
22. **All sub-juniors riding in the Paso Fino division and all juniors in the Welsh division**, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, must wear properly fitting protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.
23. **THE RATED SECTIONS** of this competition are official point competitions for the USEF National and USEF Zone 10 Horse of the Year Awards Program.
24. **USEF MEMBERSHIP.** Every owner, trainer, rider, driver and handler must present a current USEF membership card or copy thereof, or pay a \$30.00 non-refundable non-member fee.
25. **USEF AMATEUR CERTIFICATION.** Any exhibitor entered in an "Amateur to Ride" class must possess a current USEF Amateur certification and present same at Horse Show Office before numbers can be picked up.
26. **PARKING.** Fire regulations prohibit exhibitor vehicles including cars, trailers, vans and campers from being parked in barn areas. Designated parking will be posted. There will be no exceptions and violators will be towed away at owner's expense.
27. **PRIZE MONEY CHECKS** will be sent by mail within thirty days of the conclusion of the show.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **ELIGIBILITY:** All Ponies, Cobs & Half-Welsh must be registered with the Welsh Pony and Cob Society of America, Inc., the WPCA, the WPCSC, or, if under one year, must be eligible for registration. Only animals registered with the Welsh Pony and Cob Society of America, Inc. will receive points. An animal must be shown under its full registered Welsh number and name. Before an animal is issued a number or enters the ring, the Show Secretary must have a copy of the Welsh Certificate of Registration in the current owner's name. If the animal is under one year and not yet registered, submit a copy of the dam's Certificate of Registration, the registration number and registered name of the sire and the proposed registration name of entry. Unnamed foals may not be shown. A breeding pony may not be shown in both Section A and Section B classes, nor may a cob be shown in both Section C and Section D classes during the same year. All leases are designated as such on animal's Certificate of Registration. Leased animals being shown must present a copy of registration listing the lessee.
2. **ENTRIES:** Copy of both sides of the Registration papers and a current measurement card **MUST** accompany each entry. Exhibitor numbers will not be assigned until **ALL** paperwork is in order and any measuring has occurred.
3. **MEASUREMENT:** All halter animals 6 years and over, and all performance animals **MUST** present a copy of a USEF permanent measurement card or measurement conducted during the current competition year, or be measured at the show. Measurement to occur on Wednesday, July 7th between NOON and 5 PM and on Thursday, July 8th and Friday, July 9th between 7 AM and 9 AM. **MEASUREMENT FORMS AVAILABLE IN SHOW OFFICE.** Halter entries will be measured first. **OWNER OF ANIMAL TO BE MEASURED MUST BE A MEMBER OF THE USEF OR PAY MEMBERSHIP FEE AT THE SHOW. THERE IS NO CHARGE FOR MEASUREMENT.**
4. **JUNIORS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO SHOW STALLIONS**
5. **DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIPS:** Except in hunter divisions, ties will be settled by the flip of a coin. In the hunter divisions, the Championship or Reserve will be awarded to the animal that scores the highest in the over fence classes.
6. **SAFETY FIRST: For animals in harness, animals must be fully bridled while hitching and unhitching. Removing bridle from an animal harnessed to a vehicle, or leaving an animal unattended while hitching, anywhere on the Showgrounds, will result in instant elimination and removal from the Showgrounds. See helmet rule on page 9, sections 21 and 22.**

2010 WPCSA CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

WPCSA BREED CLASSES (Article 110.2)

Animals are to be shown in hand at a walk and a trot except in group classes. Purebred Welsh to be judged 85% on breed type, conformation, **way of going, quality and substance and 15% on disposition and manners. Natural reaching action is desired.** Half-Welsh to be judged 85% on conformation, **way of going, quality and substance and 15% on Welsh breed type, disposition and manners.**

WPCSA WELSH ENGLISH PLEASURE (Article 112.3)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring on light contact without martingale. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working class to be judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA WELSH WESTERN PLEASURE (Article 112.4)

To be shown at a walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring without martingale on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. To be judged 65% on performance with emphasis on manners; 25% on breed type, movement and conformation; 10% on appointments. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA WELSH HUNTER (Article 112.5)** Over fences (o/f): To be shown over a course of a minimum of six fences with eight jumping efforts of the required height. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes judged 100% on performance. Animals not exceeding 13.2 hands will jump 2'0", animals exceeding 13.2 hands shall jump 2'6". Under saddle (u/s): To be eligible, pony/cob must have shown in and completed an over fence class. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. **May be required to gallop one way of the ring, but no more than eight animals at one time.**

WPCSA SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER (Article 112.6)**

Division is open to riders 12 years and under. Classes are open to all ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Riders in this division, including the under saddle class, may not compete over fences in any other division except Short Stirrup Equitation. Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts required. May either trot or canter the entire course. Over-fence classes must precede the under saddle class. To be judged 100% on performance. To be eligible for the under saddle class, pony must be entered and complete a course in at least one over-fence class. Under-saddle class animals shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter.

WPCSA PLEASURE DRIVING (Article 113.1)

To be shown to a suitable two or four-wheeled vehicle or four-wheeled vehicle for pairs, but not a viceroy, racing sulky or fine harness rig. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, working trot and trot on and stand quietly and except for tandems, **to back readily.** To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA CARRIAGE DRIVING (Article 113.2)

(Wire wheeled vehicles can be used.) In addition to the gaits detailed in the pleasure driving section (Article 113.1), carriage driving also requires the slow trot which is slower and more collected but not to the degree required in the dressage collected trot. The animal should indicate a willingness to be driven on the bit while maintaining a steady cadence. Turnout to be judged 70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, neatness and appropriateness of attire and overall impression; 30 % on performance, manners and way of going. Working class to be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going; 20% on condition and fit of harness and vehicle; 10% on neatness of attire. Obstacle/Cones to be judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION (Article 114.1)

Under saddle (u/s) Division is open to riders 12 years and under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. To be judged 100% on hands, seat, control and suitability of mount. Riders in this division may not compete over fences in any other division except Short Stirrup Hunter. Animals must walk, trot and canter. Over Fences (o/f): Courses must be set at 18" with a minimum of four fences with eight jumping efforts required. Animals may either trot or canter the entire course. The o/f class must precede the u/s class.

WPCSA HUNTER SEAT EQUITATION (Article 114.3 2 / 114.4 3)

Classes open to ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Over Fence classes to be shown over a minimum of six obstacles. To be judged 100% on the rider's appearance, seat, hands and control of their mount. Animals not exceeding 13.2 hands will jump 2'0", animals exceeding 13.2 and not over 14.2 hands shall jump 2'6". Under saddle classes to be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Test may be required.

WPCSA STOCK SEAT EQUITATION (Article 114.3 2 / 114.5)

Classes are open to ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Riders to be judged 100% on seat, hands, performance of animal, appointments of animal and rider and suitability of animal to rider. Riders enter the ring at a walk or jog and are judged at the flat-footed four beat walk, two-beat jog and a three-beat lope both ways of the ring. All competitors are required to back a straight line during the line up. Tests may be required.

WPCSA LEADING REIN (Article 115.1)

Section A, B, C or Half-Welsh, mare or gelding 12.2 hands and under, to be ridden by junior exhibitors at least four but not more than eight years of age. Ponies to be judged on manners, suitability, breed type, conformation and turnout. This is not an equitation class.

WPCSA CHILD'S FIRST PONY (Article 115.2)

Section A, B, C or Half-Welsh, mare or gelding 12.2 hands and under, to be ridden by junior exhibitors at least four but not more than ten years of age. Riders to be suitably dressed in Hunt, Saddle or Western attire including protective headgear. Ponies to be shown at a walk and trot or jog, both ways of the ring. Ponies to be judged on performance, manners and suitability. Conformation, way of going and turnout to be emphasized. This is not an equitation class.

WPCSA TRAIL (Article 115.3)

English or Western equipment. Open to all ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. To be shown over and through obstacles at a walk, optional trot or jog and optional canter or lope. To be judged 100% on performance. Juniors will not side pass or lope/canter over loose rails.

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk-trot/jog, and leadline walk-trot poles.

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK-TROT (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/Half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk and trot/jog. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 and over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain

leadlines. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes except costume and leading rein, leadline walk, leadline walk-trot/jog and leadline walk-trot poles.

WPCSA WALK (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. English or Western attire is acceptable. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk-trot, walk-trot poles. To walk both ways of the ring.

WPCSA WALK-TROT (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. Possible tests to include: walk, trot/jog, turn, halt and rein back at spots marked. English or Western attire is acceptable. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk, walk-trot poles.

WPCSA SHOWMANSHIP (Article 115.6)

Judged on presentation and showman's ability to show his/her pony/cob. 40% of the judging is on neatness and appearance of the showman, pony and tack, 60% will be based on the exhibitor's ability to present his/her pony/cob. Exhibitor's will be informed of the judges choice of pattern to be used, before entering the ring.

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC SEC. C & D (Article 115.7)**

This class is for registered Welsh Cobs and Welsh Ponies of Cob Type 4 years of age and over. To be judged 50% on performance and 50% on conformation. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter, displaying Welsh movement as described in the breed description. An individual performance showing all gaits in both directions by each participant will be required (the gallop need only be shown in one direction). Each animal will then be stripped for conformation judging. Once an entry has been judged for conformation it can be retacked. UK Judge or qualified American Judge to officiate.

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC SEC. A & B (Article 115.8)**

This class is for registered Welsh ponies, Section A & B, 4 years of age and over. To be judged 50% on performance and 50% on conformation. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter, displaying Welsh movement as described in the breed description. An individual performance showing all gaits in both directions by each participant will be required (the gallop need only be shown in one direction). Each animal will then be stripped for conformation judging. Once an entry has been judged for conformation it can be retacked. UK Judge or qualified American Judge to officiate.

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC

To be judged 50% on conformation and 50% on ridden performance. Open to the first and second place winners from the Ridden Welsh A/B Classic and the Ridden Welsh C/D Classic classes. There is no entry fee for this class. Places will be awarded for Best Ridden and Reserve Best Ridden. Any animal in the class is eligible to be named Best Ridden. Entries shall enter the arena at the walk in a clockwise direction. The judge shall request all four gaits (walk, trot, canter, gallop) in at least one direction but animals need not show in both directions. The judge shall consider the size of the ponies/cobs, ages of the riders and safety of arena when determining whether to have the animals perform as a group or individually. Individual pattern is optional at the judge's discretion. Entries shall not be stripped as conformation score from the qualifying class shall be carried forward. Best Ridden shall receive three points, Reserve Best Ridden shall receive 2 points. Points are doubled for Silver shows and tripled for Gold shows.

WPCSA LONG STIRRUP EQUITATION (Article 116.2) – Ages 13-17

Division open to riders 13-17. Classes are open to all ponies/cobs/Half-Welsh. To be judged 100% on hands, seat, control and suitability of mount. Riders in this division may not compete over fences in any other division except long stirrup hunter. Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts required. The over-fence class must precede the under-saddle class.

WPCSA ADULT LOW HUNTER (Article 112.8)

Division is open to adult riders mounted on ponies/cobs and Half-Welsh. Riders in this division, including the under saddle class may not compete in any other over fence division for the entire show season. Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts required. Over-fence classes must precede the under-saddle classes. To be judged 100% on performance. May either trot or canter the entire course.
